- A. The Hebrew word (kuwn) is used for God's activities.
 - a. In creation
 - 1) "When He established the heavens, I was there" (Prov. 8:27).
 - 2) The LORD by wisdom founded the earth, by understanding He *established* the heavens" (Prov. 3:19).
 - 3) "Thus says the LORD who made {the earth,} the LORD who formed it to *establish* it, the LORD is His name" (Jer. 33:2).
 - 4) "The LORD has *established* His throne in the heavens, and His sovereignty rules over all" (Psalm 103:19).
 - 2. The word is used in relation to His people and their worship.
 - 1) "Is not He your Father who has bought you? He has made you and *established* you" (Deut. 32:6).
 - "You will bring them and plant them in the mountain of Your inheritance, the place, O LORD, which You have made for Your dwelling, the sanctuary, O LORD, which Your hands have *established*" (Ex. 15:17).
 - B. We are made in the image of God, so not surprisingly, this word is also used to refer to what we do.
 - 1. When used in a moral sense, the word means to be directed or fixed aright, to be *steadfast*.
