. . . as for you speak the things which are fitting for **sound doctrine**, vs. 1.

To whom is the Lord instructing Titus to speak these words?

How do we live lives that "fit" what we believe?

<u>Older men</u>: are to be temperate, dignified, sensible, sound in faith, in love, in perseverance.

<u>Older women</u>: are to be reverent in their behavior, not malicious gossips nor enslaved to much wine, teaching what is good, so that they may encourage the young women

Young women: are to love their husbands, to love their children, to be sensible, pure, workers at home, kind, being subject to their own husbands

Young men: to be sensible

<u>Bondslaves</u>: to be subject to their own masters in everything, to be well-pleasing, not argumentative, not pilfering, but showing all good faith so that they will adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in every respect.

Why is it important to live our lives in keeping with what we believe?

. . . speak the things which are **fitting for sound** doctrine.

Older men are to be temperate, dignified, sensible, sound in faith, in love, in perseverance. Likewise urge the young men to be sensible; in all things show yourself to be an example of good deeds, with purity in doctrine, dignified, sound in speech which is beyond reproach, so that the opponent will be put to shame, having nothing bad to say about us. Urge bondslaves to be subject to their own masters in everything, to be well-pleasing, not argumentative, not pilfering, but showing all good faith so that they will adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in every respect.

~ dishonor: reviled, malign, blasphemed

~ adorn: make attractive

What is in keeping with the doctrine of God for young women?

For the grace of God has appeared,

1. bringing salvation to all men

2. instructing us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires . . .

- ~ in loving our husbands
- ~ in loving our children
- ~ in being sensible, self-controlled, discreet
- ~ in being pure
- ~ in being workers at home
- ~ in being kind

3. instructing us . . . to live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age.

~ in loving our husbands

Wives, be subject to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife. . . . the wives ought to be to their husbands in everything . . . the wife must see to it that she respects her husband. ~ Ephesians 5:22-33

~ in loving our children

Do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

~ in being sensible, self~controlled, discreet Your adornment . . . let it be the hidden person of the heart, with the imperishable quality of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is precious in the sight of God.
