What primary Bible passages come to your mind as you read this assignment?

To what degree does the story accurately reflect Bible teaching?

While Diabolus has a fixation with holding war councils and customizing strategies aimed at Mansoul's fall, a recovered Mansoul under Lord Will-be-will's and Captain Self-denial's leadership has developed a fixation with ridding the town of as many Diabolonians as possible. One wave of cleansing after another has taken place throughout the story, yet another, often powerful Diabolonian always seems to have eluded their sweeps. The Diabolonians not only are located with great difficulty, but they prove hard to kill, and they are prone to find ways of escape. The recent demise of Evil-questioning (last reading) becomes the catalyst for yet another diligent search to rid the town of Diabolonians, their children, and even their houses. Their pedigrees are always extensive.

As the story ends, no fewer than 16 additional Diabolonians are found and rigorous, though not always successful, attempts are made to suppress and rid the town of them.

- Mr. Wrong-thoughts of Christ (son of Evil-questioning) arrested, imprisoned, died of consumption
- Mr. Clip-promise (son of Evil-questioning) arrested, put in the pillory (public stocks), whipped by all the children and servants in Mansoul, then hanged until dead. His ambition had been to "clip" the strength or force of the promises of Shaddai.
- Mr. Carnal-sense (son of Evil-questioning) arrested and imprisoned, but inexplicably escapes, lurking about the town. A bounty is put on his head.
- Mr. Live-by-feeling (son of Evil-questioning) arrested and imprisoned until his death
- Mr. Self-love (son of Evil-questioning) arrested and imprisoned, but because of his friendship with many Mansoulians, they were loath to put him to trial quickly. Only at Captain Self-Denial's insistence was Mr. Self-love turned over to the soldiers to be brained.


